In PHSE this term, we will be learning on the theme of 'Keeping Myself Safe.' This topic explores areas such as bullying, medications online safety and risk taking, and we will learn how to weigh up the pros and cons of a situation to know how to act in that situation.

Our indoor sport this term is swimming, and we will be continuing from where we left off in Year 4. All of Year 5 will be swimming on Thursday afternoons.

Elm Class will be starting Hockey in Term 3 on Tuesday afternoons. Oak Class will be using their Forest School sessions as their outdoor PE time.

Our topic question this term is: Who were the superheroes of the past?

Welcome back to Term 3!

This term, we have an exciting book in 'Arthur and the Golden Rope'. This book is heavily based on Norse mythology, so we will be learning about the lives and legends of the Viking era, everyday life for Viking people and learning all about the unusual and fantastical tales that Vikings would tell around a cosy winter's fire. See what you can find on Viking mythology and tell us what you know!

In English, our main text will be Arthur and the Golden Rope and so we will be emulating the style of the myths and legends in our own tales. We will also be learning about various poetical forms and begin to write some of our own. Vikings are famous for their lyrical ability - can you become the next famous Viking poet?

In Maths this term, (after finishing some fraction work!), we will be exploring multiplication and division in more depth. Building on from work in term 2, where we have learnt how to multiply by multiples of 10, this term we are beginning to multiply 2- and 3digit numbers by other 2- and 3-digit numbers.

Keep practising your times tables on Times Table Rock Stars! Everything is so much easier when you know them!

In our French lessons, we are going to continue to learn vocabulary, including nouns for everyday items, family members and pets! Our teachers remain the same for cover on Wednesday afternoons. Mr Peach will be covering Oak and Mrs Olley will be teaching Elm class.

Forest School will continue for OAK class this term. Forest school will take place on TUESDAY afternoons.

Remember: You will need a coat and wellington boots, as well as a change of clothes, to really enjoy Forest School as it is meant to be enjoyed!
