In English, our main text will be *The Darkest Dark*, an incredible story about Chris Hadfield, the first Canadian astronaut and member of the International Space Station. We have been focusing on developing our sentences from simple to complex, and including figurative language such as personification and similes. What figurative language can you spot in your books?

In Maths this term, we are going to move on from fractions to decimals, as we begin to look more closely at how the 'bits' of whole numbers work!

Keep practising your times tables on Times Table Rock Stars! Everything is so much easier when you know them!

In our French lessons, we are going to learn how to talk about the pets we have at home and in school. What pets do you have at home? Can you say this in French?

In ICT this term, we will be using different media to write, record edit and share our own podcasts.

Mrs Olley will be taking Elm class for RE and Connected learning, while Mr Peach will be covering Oak class and taking them for Connected Learning and French.
