By the end of Year 4, the aim is your child will be confident with all their times tables. They will be expected to complete a multiplication tables check for all the tables, set by the government. THIS IS AT THE START OF NEXT TERM. The test is 25 random times table questions from 1 to 12 x and they have 6 seconds to answer. The test is similar to the soundcheck on TT Rockstars. The key to knowing and recalling at speed is repetition. This could be	We recommend that you listen to your child read and discuss the content for at least 15 minutes; at least 3 times a week. This ensures that they have understood what they have read and that they begin to decode unfamiliar words, which will also support them within their own writing. Please refer to your child's reading record for suggested questions. Once read please record in their reading record when you have heard them read and add any useful comments for the class teacher. Once your child has finished the book they need to complete the AR quiz (comprehension quiz) on the book in school before changing for a new one.	Please see the separate spelling sheet for the weekly spelling set for the whole term. Please can you encourage children to understand the meaning of the words, spelling rules (if it applies to the word) and practice how to spell them correctly. This could be done on paper, computer or verbally and with activities such as look, say, cover, write check, games or sentences.	Create and write a rainforest recipe (ingredients that come from the rainforest or make something that looks like the rainforest or an animal from there). You could even make it and add videos or photos to show what you have made. <b>Geography</b> Create a PowerPoint/ slides on Seesaw about rainforests around the world. Include a labelled map, labelled pictures, facts about the climate, facts about the animals, facts about tribes etc.	Find out about products which come from the Rainforest Identify what they are used for and who uses them. Which of these products do you use in your home? How far have these products had to travel for you to use them? Present your findings on a fact sheet. <b>Computing</b> Imagine being a nature presenter like David Attenborough. Create a short film about an animal (this could be a pet, wild animal, animals at the zoo or pretend animal using models, toys or pictures). Video and edit to create a short nature film.
